

5th Grade Arts Festival



Every October the Boone County Arts Council hosts the 5th Grade Arts Festival, a three day creative fest held at the Boone County Community Building. Over the course of three days 700 students from all six of the District 100 schools, Immanuel Lutheran and St. James Catholic were immersed in a creative environment of learning and exploration facilitated by local professional artists.



Mark Dvorak, teacher at the Old Town School of Music in Chicago, offered an interactive program on The History of American Folk Music. Mary Reed of the Rockford Dance Company had the students dancing. Norm Knott, internationally known recycle artist, shared his passion and expertise for everything reusable, the students made their own small collages from upcycled materials. Students returned to school with the pieces and the challenge to create a 'quilt' that would bring all of their designs together. Belvidere High School retired theater teacher Dan Holmes and Gary Tate retired fifth grade teacher, led the students in exercises of improvisation and puppetry, respectively. New this year, photographers Jeremy Schulz and Bill Eklund gave inspiring demonstrations on a variety of photographic techniques.



During the lunch hour Dan Foster lead the Belvidere High School and Belvidere North High School bands, offering the students an interactive musical extravaganza to entertain and recruit future players. It is a privilege to witness the creativity and enthusiasm that the students bring with them each year, and surely a privilege to help inspire the future of the arts. We offer a heartfelt thank you to the talented teachers, generous donors and dedicated volunteers who make this event so successful.

Belvidere High School Lunchtime Connection



On February 20, the Arts Council “took the show on the road” to Belvidere High School Lunchtime Connection. In 1990 BHS Art teacher, Kit Scheidenhelm, and English teacher, Kathy Calwell, created a student-to-student exchange project in collaboration with the Ukrainian Sister Cities group in Rockford.

Following the Chernobyl nuclear meltdown and the aftermath many children were hospitalized with radiation poisoning. Belvidere students drew and painted pieces to be sent to children in Brovary, Russia (Ukraine was part of the USSR at that time) to cheer them up. In return, students in Brovary painted pictures and wrote letters and sent them to Belvidere High School. The Arts Council has those pieces of art and the translated letters and displays them to keep the history and tell the story of how art bridges the gap between people
